are described for you:

- *An architectural and historic structures survey has been accomplished by over 100 volunteers under the direction of Ann Klemme. More than 500 homes, schools, and churches in our Township have been researched, computerized, evaluated, and described in a report submitted to the State of New Jersey for consideration to the State and National Registers of Historic Places. In addition, a committee is planning a publication based on the results of the survey.
- *Four membership programs, organized by Joan Chesley, included a standing-room-only slide presentation of Hartshorn houses by Van Reintjes; two sessions devoted to Survey findings (350 residents attended); and a slide program featuring local gardens by former resident Lois Poinier. Our June program is described on the preceding page.
- *Slide shows about Millburn's history have been shown to local groups by Lennard Fisk and his committee. Mr. Fisk is currently working on a slide show to celebrate the Battle of Springfield, and he and other members of the Township committee he co-chairs are planning celebrations of the Battle of Springfield.
- *A membership directory was issued with a cover design by Jane Riedel, our talented membership chairman. Jane also has done sketches from old photographs of historic places in town for note paper. Judy Adams is working on printing and marketing them. Most of our maps and trivets have been sold, as well as almost 3000 copies of "A Little History."
- *Other activities included exhibits at the library (Gloria Patrizio): a genealogy course co-sponsored with the Arboretum (Fran Land); oral history interviews (Eileen McHugh); articles, photographs for newspapers, and posters for meetings (Justine Kovacs); high school liaison and history prize (Judy Bailey); acquiring, preserving, cataloguing our photograph collection (Owen Lampe); and publication of the Thistle (Aline Coles and Jeanne O'Donnell. After three years of dedicated service, they have decided to step down as editors of the Thistle after this issue. We shall miss them!)

AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION - The following are amendments to the Society's constitution to be considered at the annual meeting on June 3rd:

Article 5, Section 2. The Board of Directors shall consist of the five officers and six trustees elected as provided by the by-laws, and the most recent past president, ex-officio.

Article 5, Section 3. Any director who is absent for two or more regular board meetings during a calendar year without notifying the President of the Society of such absence in advance of the meeting may be subject to removal at the discretion of the board.

Article 6 - Audit. Change calendar year to fiscal year; two occurrences.
