Thanks for a job well done to retiring Board members Margaret Coffey, George Clare, Diane Jozsa, Charlanne Lamberto, Kate Stryker and Eileen Sullivan.

Changes in the By-laws to be voted on are as follows:

Article II, Section 3

Change the number of Trustees from six to twelve with four Trustees instead of three being elected annually.

Article III, Quorum

Change the number of Board members constituting a quorum from eight to nine.

WYOMING RECORDS - The Wyoming Civic Association has donated to the Society the records of the Association which was formed in 1907.

When the MSHHS obtained use of a quiet room in the Millburn Public Library to house its archives, Howard Brahm, an advisor to the Society and also chairman of the historical committee of the Wyoming Civic Association, thought the Library a safer repository for the records than his attic. His suggestion to guarantee the permanency of the records was accepted by both organizations.

Consisting of various reports, clippings and pamphlets, the records of the Wyoming Civic Association provide a unique insight into Millburn's past. There are annual reports for the Township for the years 1907, 1908 and 1909 as well as a list of persons invited to the dedication on January 21, 1911 of the newly built Wyoming School which replaced an older one on Cypress Street. An undated survey to determine if members of the Wyoming Civic Association would be willing to spend \$1.00 to have mail delivered to their homes, a Township milk ordinance for the year 1922, and a pamphlet entitled "The Mosquito Nuisance in Millburn Township and How to Abate It" published by the Millburn Board of Health in 1906 are clues to the way things were in the first quarter of this century.

HISTORIC HOMES OF MILLBURN - SHORT HILLS



In earlier issues we have written about the house at 41 Main Street and the Bodwell House on Millburn Avenue in the conviction that some of our readers are curious about and appreciative of the older homes which lend distinction to our community. We now draw your attention to the white clapboard house at 7 Parsonage Hill Road, on the corner of Old Short Hills Road, owned by Robert Smith, a life member of the MSHHS. The gabled roof, stone foundation and front porch with ornate arches bespeak its age, but there is little definite information about when the house was built.

Robert Smith says that the house was built in three sections, the oldest part being on the right front. He believes that part of the house may have been built in the 1700s while he dates the newer left hand side to 1868. That date and the names of workers who

built the addition are written on a wall in the attic of the older section. The initials of one of the workers - A.E. for Albert Ellis, a painter - are also scratched into the glass of a third floor window. The third section of the house is a wing on the back added in the 1920s. An outbuilding with stone fireplace which once served as a summer kitchen is now used for pool storage.

The earliest map in the Historical Society collection showing a house on this corner is dated 1859, but Township records go further back and chronicle almost a dozen owners between 1855 and 1967 when Robert Smith bought it. At the time that Dr. T.Y. Sutphen owned the home in the first decade of this century, he called it "White Gables". We rather think names like that and "Sunset Cottage" and "Redstone" are more imaginative than numbered addresses. "White Gables" or #7 Parsonage Hill Road, we are thankful that the present owner has maintained the pyhsical integrity of his 19th century Gothic Revival style home for all of us to enjoy as we pass by.


